This 4 hour workshop covers:

- Information on the asylum seeker and refugee experience for young people, including their education experiences prior to coming to Australia
- The impact of trauma on young people's learning and wellbeing
- Strategies that support the recovery process which teachers and other staff can adapt for use in the classroom
- A whole school approach to working with trauma and key areas where schools can increase support for students from a refugee background
- Information on MRC and Phoenix Centre services

Who should attend?

This training is appropriate for those working in and with schools and other educational settings: at early childhood, primary, secondary and post-compulsory levels.
